Text 4: Chris Bowen, Pejabat Australia yang Giat Belajar Bahasa Indonesia

Read this article and answer Question 11 in Indonesian in approximately 150 words.

Adakah pejabat Australia yang belajar bahasa Indonesia? Jawabannya ada. Namanya Chris Bowen, yang juga menjadi juru bicara oposisi urusan perbendaharaan negara (*Treasurer*).

Bowen terangkan bahwa mempelajari bahasa Indonesia adalah salah satu hal yang tidak kalah penting dalam hidupnya.

'Mengapa menjadi sangat penting? Saya memiliki pertanyaan yang benar-benar murni: adakah dua negara di belahan dunia lain yang lokasinya sangat berdekatan tetapi secara budaya sangat jauh berbeda?' tanyanya Bowen.

Bowen merasa dengan sedikitnya pemahaman soal budaya di antara kedua negara, maka Australia perlu melakukan tindakan yang proaktif untuk berinisiatif membangun hubungan yang lebih mendalam.

'Sebagai sebuah bangsa, kita harus lebih banyak mendukung penggunaan bahasabahasa dari kawasan Asia. Mereka yang berada di Parlemen Australia tidak bisa hanya mengatakan "Kamu harus belajar bahasa Asia" kepada generasi muda, jika kita sendiri tidak melakukannya,' jelas Bowen.

Bowen berpendapat mempelajari bahasa baru bukanlah masalah, terlepas dari usianya yang sudah lebih dari 40 tahun dan di tengah kesibukannya dalam bekerja dan mengurus keluarganya. Dia mengaku dia belum percaya diri jika menyangkut pembicaraan mendetail dan rumit mengenai isu keuangan, sesuai dengan bidang tugasnya di oposisi.

Saat wartawan ABC mencoba menyapa Chris Bowen dengan bahasa Indonesia lewat Twitter, dia pun menjawabnya dengan ramah.

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Question 13


The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Indonesia is seeking submissions from Australian youth who are studying Bahasa Indonesia.

 - a social issue (e.g. education, environment, health or poverty) that is affecting Indonesia
 - a political issue that is affecting Indonesia
- a brief closing statement.
