# MEDIA PRODUCTION AND ANALYSIS

### Practical (production) examination

Schools are required to submit their candidates' ATAR course Practical (production) examination submissions by **4 pm** on **Tuesday**, **17 September 2024**.

## Materials required for this examination

#### To be submitted by the candidate

An ATAR course Practical (production) examination submission that must:

- include a USB (including the 'backup copy') which contains **one** single practical (production) submission in an A4 clear plastic button document wallet
- include the completed *Production submission cover sheet*
- one copy of the *Practical (production) statement* (up to two single-sided A4 pages)
- be accompanied by a completed *Declaration of authenticity*.

## Important note to candidates

It is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that each item submitted is labelled securely with their WA student number. A candidate's name, names of persons associated with the candidate's school and the school name must **not** appear on any item, nor should the work contain evidence of previous marking.

Any ATAR course Practical (production) examination submitted to the Authority without a completed *Declaration of authenticity* will result in a referral to the Breach of Examination Rules committee

Candidates may choose to provide a second backup USB clearly labelled 'backup copy' which will only be accessed should the original be faulty.

### Structure of the examination

The Media Production and Analysis ATAR course examination consists of a written component and a practical (production) component.
