<b>Change of contact details</b>	If you are no longer an OLNA contact at the school to which this email was addressed, please forward to the new contact person or to another member of the school leadership team.
<b>Disability codes for upload</b>	Schools who load adjustment requests into the OLNA Dashboard will note that the disability adjustment codes have changed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Schools who enter disabilities directly into the OLNA Dashboard will not need to do anything different.</li><li>• For schools who download the previous round adjustment requests and upload these adjustment requests into the new round, no action is required as the previous round disability codes have been updated to match the new codes.</li><li>• For schools who wish to add students and adjustments to the upload file, schools should note that <u>new disability adjustment codes will need to be used</u>. See attached for the updated list (this list replaces Appendix 2 of the <i>OLNA Dashboard User Guide</i>). This change has occurred as certain characters are no longer accepted by the system e.g. ,()/</li></ul>
<b>Additional Example tests</b>	The Authority has developed new example tests for Reading and Numeracy. These tests are labelled 'Reading 2' and 'Numeracy 2'. The original example tests are labelled 'Reading 1' and 'Numeracy 1'.
<b>Users access to the OLNA Dashboard</b>	All schools are automatically allocated two accounts to access the OLNA Dashboard. Each account name is comprised of the school code and a letter: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Principal's account is school code followed by the letter A: (example username: 0000A)</li><li>• OLNA School Contact's account is school code followed by the letter B: (example username: 0000B)</li></ul> Note: Names and email addresses are updated from SIRS each morning. The Principal's account can create additional users within the dashboard.
<b>Students in the OLNA Dashboard</b>	Students are loaded into the OLNA Dashboard between 9am and 10am each morning. Please note that this may take longer on the 9-11 February when many schools are uploading students' data to SIRS.
<b>OLNA Checklists</b>	Schools are reminded that the <i>OLNA Handbook</i> contains important checklists (Appendices 5 and 6) that will assist schools in preparing for the OLNA.
<b>Requests for adjustments: Disability and EAL/D</b>	All requests for adjustment for students with disability or non-ATAR EAL/D students must be entered into the OLNA Dashboard by <b>Friday, 11 February 2022</b> .
<b>Declaration form</b>	Submission of the completed <i>OLNA Declaration form</i> for Round 1 was due <b>Friday, 4 February 2022</b> . Please submit if you have not already done so.
