#### Indonesia dan Australia Membahas Kerjasama Ekonomi Hijau

Setiap hari, pabrik Mohamad Lutfi yang beroperasi di Jawa Timur mengolah lima puluh ton sampah plastik menjadi barang baru, yaitu palet, yang kemudian dijual kepada industri-industri lain untuk mengangkut produk-produknya. Seperti kebanyakan warga Indonesia, Mohamad melihat bahwa banyak sampah plastik yang mencemari tanah, lautan, dan sungai di daerahnya. Memang memprihatinkan karena Indonesia dikenal sebagai negara penyumbang sampah plastik ke laut yang kedua terbesar di dunia sesudah Cina.

Untunglah sampah plastik itu merupakan bahan dasar murah yang digunakan oleh pabrik Mohamad itu. Pabrik ini merupakan kerjasama perusahaan daur ulang Re>Pal di Australia dengan pemerintah daerah dan masyarakat lokal di Pasuruan, Jawa Timur. Kerjasama ini termasuk mengumpulkan sampah plastik dari bisnis-bisnis di Indonesia dan juga membeli plastik dari pemulung sampah.

Menurut Mohamad, inisiatif daur ulang perusahaan Re>Pal ini merupakan salah satu contoh model bisnis kerjasama antara Indonesia dan Australia yang berfokus pada masalah lingkungan atau perubahan iklim. Akan tetapi, sampai sekarang kemajuan kerjasama antara kedua negara bertetangga ini agak lambat.

Di tingkat pemerintah, Presiden Indonesia dan Perdana Menteri Australia juga sudah mengeluarkan Pernyataan Bersama tentang Kerjasama Ekonomi Hijau dan Transisi Energi. Kedua negara setuju dalam berkolaborasi untuk mendukung pertumbuhan ekonomi. Beberapa hal yang ditekankan adalah pelestarian lingkungan serta penggunaan energi bersih dan sumber daya yang dapat diperbarui supaya tingkat karbon tetap rendah.

Namun, dilemanya adalah ketergantungan kedua negara pada industri batu bara karena Indonesia dan Australia merupakan negara pengekspor batu bara nomor satu dan nomor dua di dunia. Pembakaran batu bara akan melepaskan banyak karbon ke atmosfer yang mengancam kesepakatan 'ekonomi hijau' ini. Tidak hanya pada industri batu bara, ekonomi Indonesia juga sangat bergantung pada industri minyak kelapa sawit. Industri ini merupakan salah satu penyebab utama deforestasi dan pencemaran sungai di pulau Sumatra dan Kalimantan.

Jelaslah bahwa transisi ke 'ekonomi hijau' ini tidak bisa terjadi tanpa dukungan bidang bisnis di kedua negara. Perusahaan Australia harus berinisiatif untuk membantu bisnis di Indonesia supaya teknologi yang ramah lingkungan dapat dikembangkan di Indonesia. Australia, sebagai salah satu negara yang paling maju di bidang teknologi energi alternatif, dapat membantu Indonesia dalam pengembangan infrastruktur dan keahlian efisiensi energi. Bantuan ini akan mendukung usaha Indonesia untuk menjadi pusat regional dalam manufaktur kendaraan listrik.
