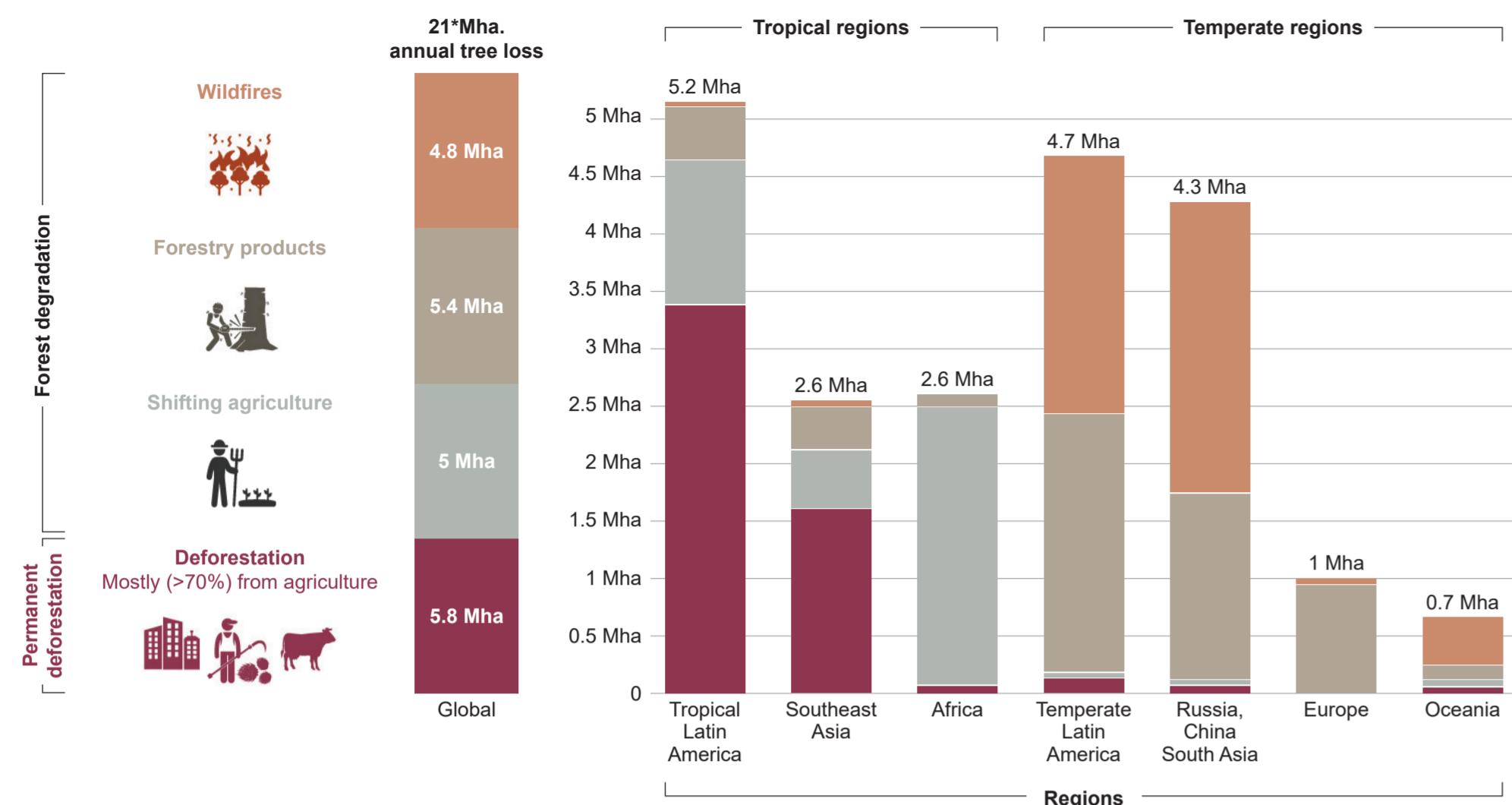

Source 4: Global forest loss: deforestation and forest degradation

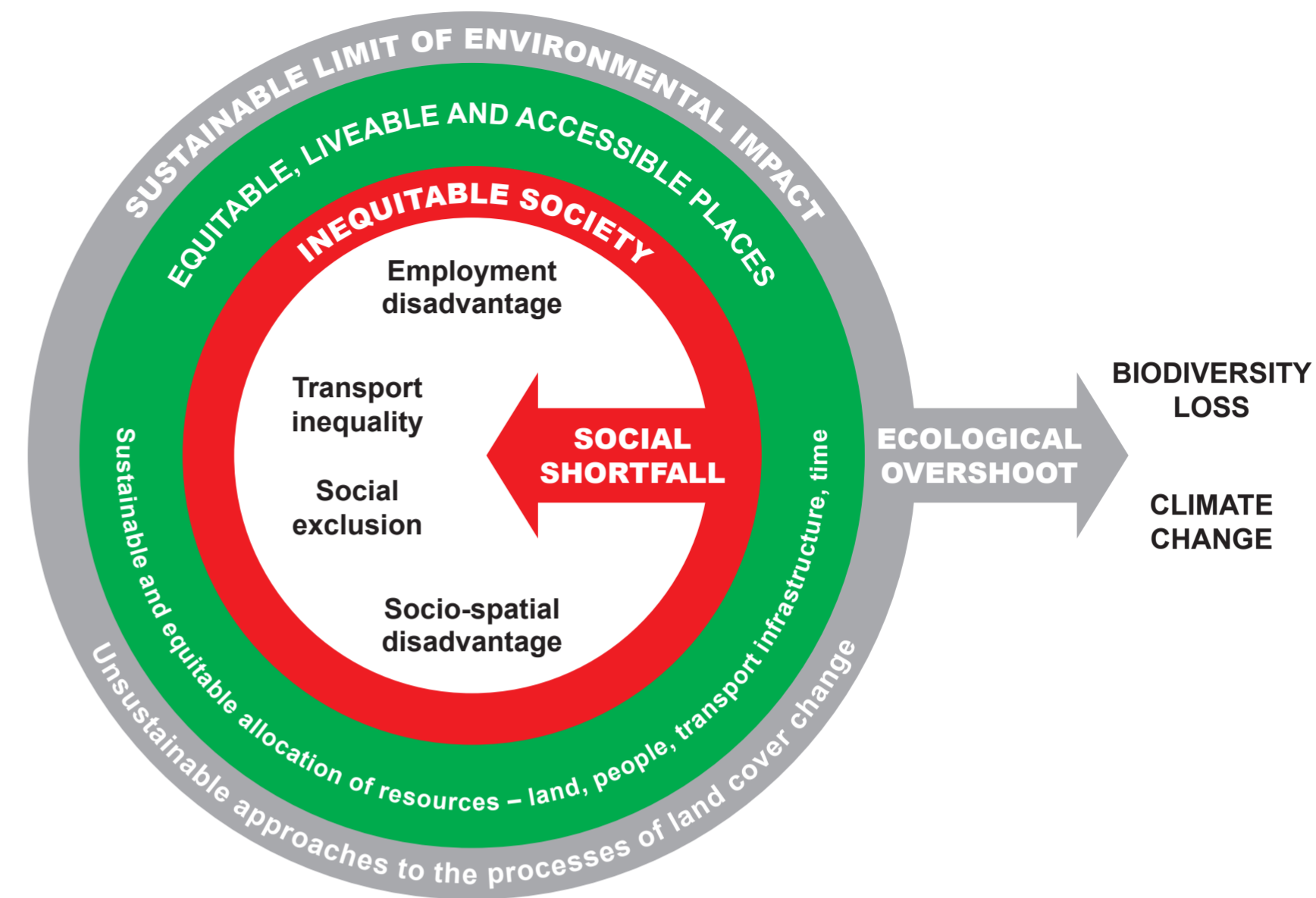

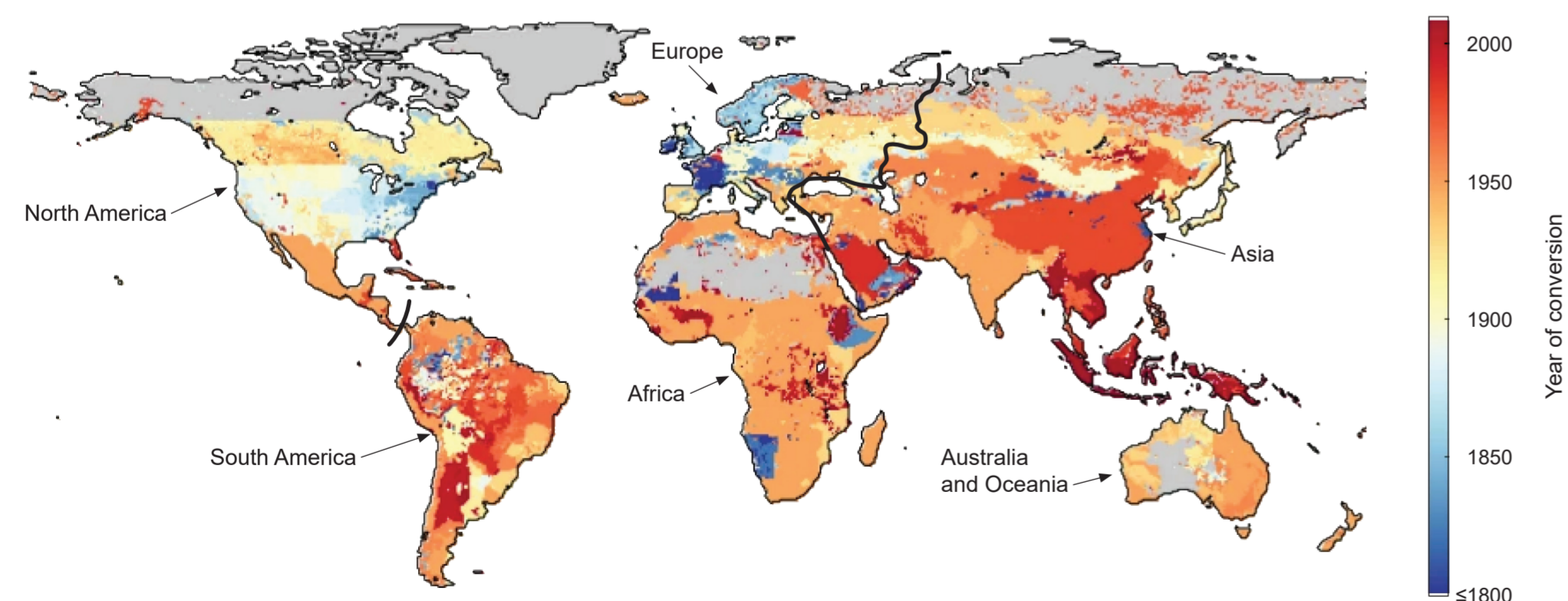
