Describe the original aims, structure and organisation of the Delian League and assess the extent to which these changed over the course of your period of study.

or

Question 4**(25 marks)**

Assess the extent of changes in Athenian foreign policy during your period of study and identify the influences (such as people, events or issues) that drove these changes.

or

Question 5**(25 marks)**

Discuss the rivalry between Cimon and Themistocles and identify the groups that supported each of them and the reasons for their support.

Question 6

(25 marks)

Outline Octavian's political and military position after Actium and discuss how this changed following the First Settlement of 27 BCE.

Question 7

(25 marks)

Describe Augustus' military reforms and assess the extent to which they represented change.

or

Question 8

(25 marks)

Describe the way in which Augustus brought about the succession of Tiberius and assess to what extent this represented political change.

Part B: Unit 3B – People, ideas and events that shaped history

You are required to answer **one (1)** of the following questions from your chosen time period of study.

Greece: The Peloponnesian War from 440/39 BCE to the surrender of Athens in 404/03 BCE

or

Rome: The Julio-Claudians from the death of Augustus in 14 CE to the death of Nero in 68 CE

Question 9**(25 marks)**

Assess the extent to which **one** of the following individuals contributed to cohesion or division in the period of study:

- (a) Pericles **or** Cleon
- (b) Claudius **or** Nero.

or

Question 10**(25 marks)**

Discuss the changes caused by **one** of the following ideas in the period of study:

- (a) The 'liberation of Greece' **or** Democracy
- (b) Succession **or** the role of the Praetorian Guard.

or

Question 11**(25 marks)**

Discuss the causes of **one** of the following events:

- (a) The Peace of Nicias **or** the Persian involvement in the Peloponnesian War
- (b) The accession of Claudius **or** the rebellion of Boudicca.
