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## Assessment Table – Modified for use in 2022

Type of assessment	Weighting
<b>Investigation</b> Students plan and conduct research and communicate their findings. Evidence can include: expedition manuals or journals, diaries, essays, reports, stories, oral and/or video presentations.	25%
<b>Performance 1: specific to outdoor adventure activity skills and strategies</b> Students develop and refine skills and strategies used in an outdoor adventure activity. Evidence is collected over a period of time and can include: checklists/rubrics, direct observation and/or video.	20%
<b>Response</b> Students analyse and respond to stimuli or prompts. Evidence can include: reflections, logbooks, journals, tests, summaries and/or essays.	25%
<b>Examination</b> Typically conducted at the end of each semester and/or unit. In preparation for Unit 3 and Unit 4, the examination should reflect the examination design brief included in the ATAR Year 12 syllabus for this course.	30%
