Excerpts from the contract are summarised below:

- Working with Children Check is current and valid for the state of Western Australia
- attend a minimum of 3 training programs per year
- · receive the minimum award rate of pay
- work a minimum of 10 hours and a maximum of 20 hours per week, as rostered
- arrive at least 10 minutes before the scheduled shift and be prepared to stay until the shift is over
- wear clothing to comply with occupational safety and health requirements, as provided
- maintain client confidentiality at all times
- report accidents or incidents immediately to the shift manager, complete appropriate documentation, notify parents and guardians
- effectively communicate with all staff and parents and guardians
- · demonstrate a high level of conflict resolution strategies
- supervise daily play activities and other activities, as required
- prepare simple meals as directed and assist with feeding
- assist with nappy changes
- use proper sanitation procedures during clean-up of food preparation and play areas.
