Example: More mobile population

Globally, there is increasing acceptance of travel for work purposes. One example of this increased mobile population is demonstrated through the increase in the number of FIFO workers.

The influence of a more mobile population for the workplace includes the need for increased logistics and managing of an employee's productivity in terms of travel time and work output. It also sees an additional expense of travel costs for the workplace.

 - personal and professional skills and attributes
 - short-term goals and long-term goals
 - any other appropriate career-related information.

(4 marks)

- a resume presented to industry standard, including:
 - personal details
 - education and training
 - achievements
 - work history
 - references and/or other evidence of good character
 - sporting associations, club membership, community associations, special interests
 - any other appropriate career-related information.

(10 marks)

• any additional documentation that you consider appropriate.
