## WACE Achievement Descriptors

- A Excellent achievement
- **B** High achievement
- **C** Satisfactory achievement
- **Completed** Met C grade standard or better for VET industry specific
  - **D** Limited achievement
  - **E** Very low achievement



## VET industry specific course delivery

- Must be delivered and assessed in partnership with an RTO
- Can be achieved through all types of delivery arrangements E.g. Profile, auspice, FFS, A/SBAT, PAiS
- The duration of a VET industry specific course can be delivered over one or two years.



## VET industry specific course delivery

- Year 11 units 1 and 2 and Year 12 units 3 and 4 are paired
- 'VET integrated' is the term used to describe the enrolment type for units of competency within a VET industry specific course. Units of competency can only be integrated into VET industry specific course units from 2015.




## VET- depth requirement

Of the 20 units required in total for a WACE

- Up to a total of 8 unit equivalents may come from VET credit transfer only or VET+ EP
- Up to a maximum of 4 unit equivalents may come form endorsed programs such as WPL

# VET industry specific courses – depth

### requirement

VET industry specific courses enable students to count their VET achievement as a course and also use the allocation of unit equivalence for additional VET credit transfer programs and/or endorsed programs.

## VET - WACE standard

Achieve at least 14 C grades or higher in Year 11 and 12 units with a minimum of six C grades in Year 12.

#### VET credit transfer

Not graded however each unit equivalent reduces the number of course units in which a C grade is required.

Unit equivalents can contribute to a maximum of four units in Year 11 and four units in Year 12

#### VET industry specific course units


When all course requirements are met the notation 'completed' is awarded for each course unit.

The notation 'completed' contributes in the same manner as a C grade or better in other General course units.

## VET industry specific course unit credit

If a student does not successfully complete all components of a VET industry specific course, the student is awarded U (Unfinished) for the Year 12 units (units 3 and 4).

Credit for the Year 11 units (units 1 and 2) for a partially completed Certificate II or Certificate III VET industry specific course may be awarded only if the following conditions are met:

**1. Qualification component:** completion of  $\geq$  110 nominal hours of the VET industry specific qualification

and

**2. Workplace learning component:** completion of at least one unit of the WPL EP in an industry relevant to the qualification industry area.



## VET - breadth requirement

VET qualifications are **not** identified as List A or List B. This rule applies to both VET credit transfer programs and VET industry specific courses.



## Industry related work place learning

- The Authority developed Workplace Learning endorsed program is a mandatory co requisite for VET industry specific course enrolments until such time as the specified number of WPL units have been met.
- Students must complete WPL in an industry context relevant to the VET industry specific course.
- The workplace must reflect typical industry workplace conditions, including time constraints, deadlines, industry realistic ratios of staff to clients, typical industry hours and workflow.
